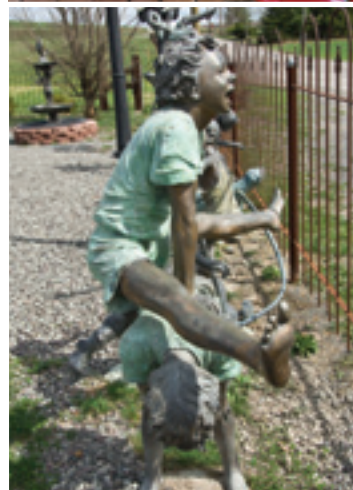

Buck's favorites are the hand-carved mahogany elephants, rhinos and such from Thailand; these are not for sale. Some of the mahogany benches feature painted scenes like bears frolicking in a river. Visitors recognize familiar figures among the fiberglass statuary, including Arnold Schwarzenegger, Michael Jordan, James Dean,



Pocahontas, John Wayne and Santa Claus. Looking for something exotic? The Egyptian frieze might fit the bill. And how about the '57 Chevy car sofa? It might look pretty swell in the family room.

For those with more pragmatic tastes, the Trading Post offers a wide range of gifts. With items like hand-carved chests and benches from Mexico, pedestal cars and rocking horses for kids, clocks, vintage signs, plant pots and baskets. You'll surely find something to please even the pickiest person on your gift list.

Be sure to take a look at the taxidermy display mounted on the walls. Dan Martin, Buck's son, has contributed about 50 examples of his award-winning handiwork from his taxidermy business, "Reflections of the Wild."

If you'd like to take one home, just ask – several pieces are for sale.

It's been a lot of fun for Buck, who says, "I'm doing what I like. I enjoy people, plus my kids and grandkids help out." But now he's ready to turn the business operation over to his daughter Diana. Although he'll only be at the Trading Post now and then, he won't be bored.
